The aged population is currently at its **highest level** in human history¹

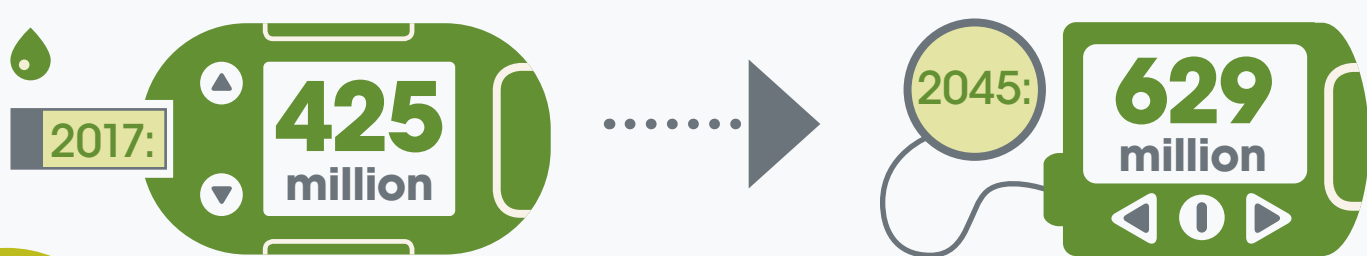
By **2050** the **global population** of people aged **over 60** is projected to reach nearly **2.1bn**²

More than **DOUBLE** the size compared to **2015**²

Recent projections show that living beyond **100 years old** will become the **norm**^{3*}



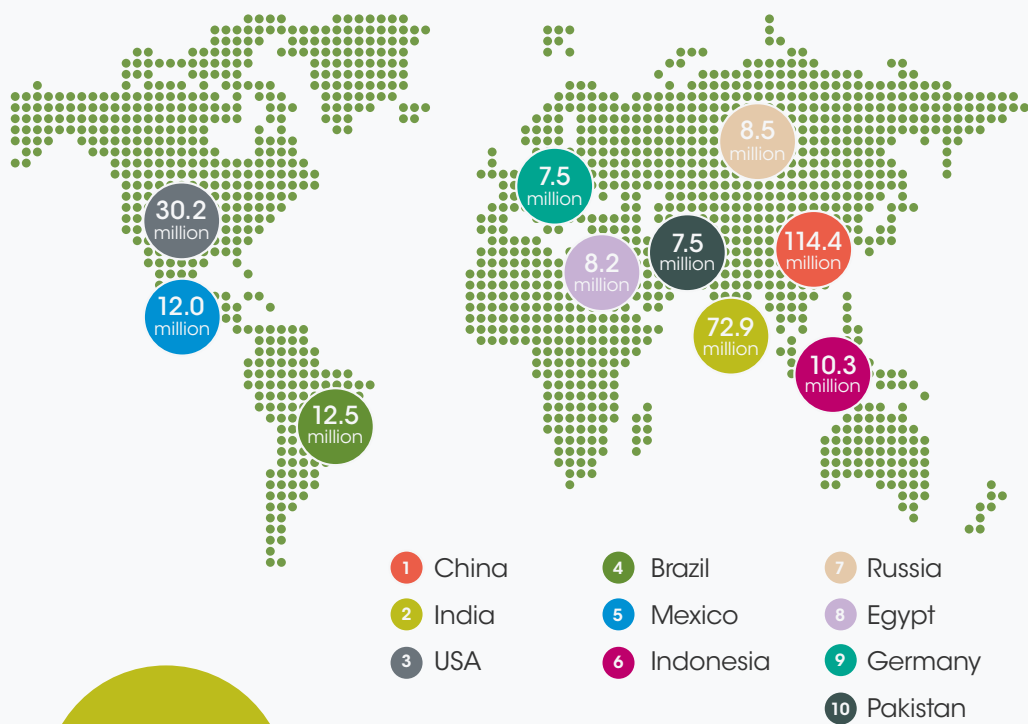
The impact of **ageing populations** and **inactive lifestyles** means that people are living longer, but with **increasing infirmity** and **chronic conditions**, such as **type 2 diabetes**⁴

TOP TEN countries/territories for number of adults with diabetes⁴

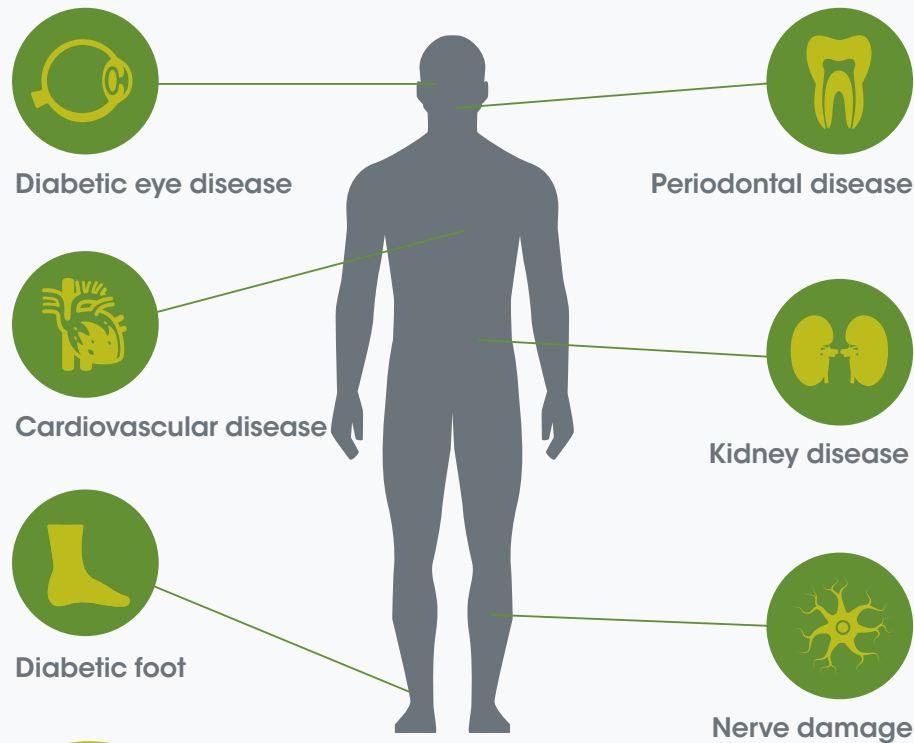


79% of estimated global expenditure on diabetes is made by the world's **economically richest regions**⁵

Diabetes complications include⁴

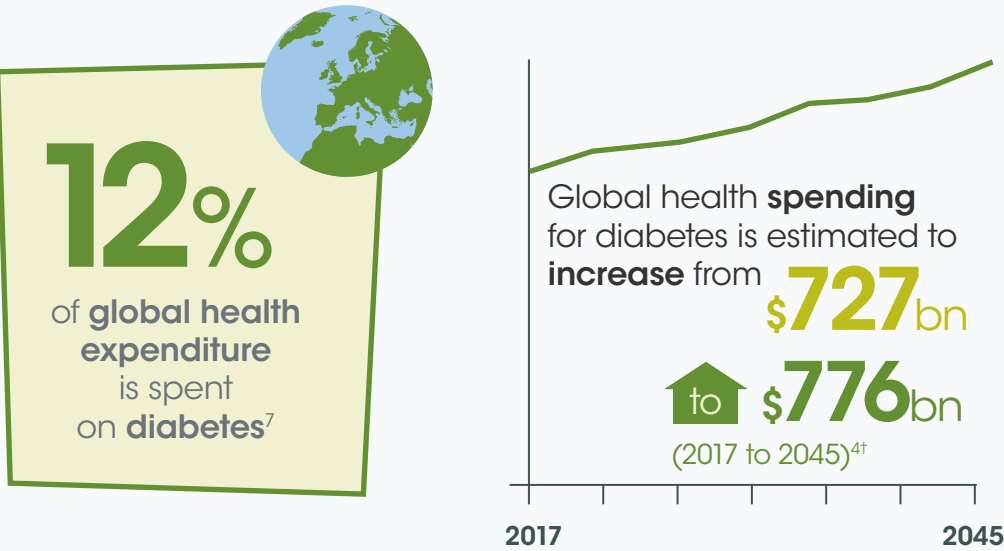


Diabetes is associated with **high medical and social costs**⁴
